Overview

This trip will be a truly extraordinary experience, providing awe-inspiring landscape and people photo opportunities. The scenery we will travel through will be varied and absolutely breathtaking, but the highlights will certainly be the magnificent moon-like landscapes and the remote people of the Himba tribes. There will also be a number of wildlife photo opportunities, ranging from cheetahs, lions, zebras and giraffes, rhinos and elephants, especially when we enter the Etosha National Park.

This trip is classified as one of our 'Tours'. This means that an experienced photographer / instructor will be travelling with you at all times, giving you instruction and helping you get great shots. Alongside your instructor will be our Namibian guides and drivers, bringing a lifetime of experience and knowledge of their wonderful country. We'll spend time in the evenings looking through your images, and there will be talks and discussions on various aspects of photography. Our 'Tours' are open to all skill levels - if you're an experienced photographer, we will ensure you get the appropriate help, and if you're a beginner just starting out - you'll be helped and guided in the best way for you. Whilst this trip involves traveling in remote areas, the accommodation, transport and guides will be of an extremely high standard. The trip will see us stay at some of Namibia's most fabulous wilderness resorts - no camping involved! From the moment you arrive to the moment you return, you will be taken care of in every way.

Please note that the quoted price for this Tour is based upon shared accommodation. If you wish to have your own room, a single room supplement of £500 is required.

Calendar

Saturday 18 September ARRIVAL DAY

Today we'll finally meet. Our guide Hans will greet you at Hosea Kutako International airport and take you to the first of many beautiful lodges in Namibia. After some time to freshen up and relax we'll have our first game drive at the Lodge experiencing right from the beginning the amazing photo opportunities that this land offers. We'll wait for the sunset with a drink. Overnight at Auas Game Lodge

Sunday 19 September TOUR DAY 1

After breakfast we drive south via Rehoboth and Kalkrand to the Kalahari Desert. The landscape is classic Kalahari: deep red longitudinal dunes, usually vegetated, separated by lighter clay inter-dune valleys covered in grass, trees and shrubs. We'll settle in our lodge and after lunch we'll have the opportunity to photograph cheetahs at feeding time. We'll get up close and personal with these magnificent animals.. We'll say hallo to Pepper the two year old cheetah with the most incredible expressive eyes. We wait for the sun to go down on the inflamed dunes and enjoy dinner together around an open fire. Overnight at Bagatelle

Monday 20 and Tuesday 21 September TOUR DAY 2-3

Just as the sun starts to warm up we'll say our goodbyes to the stunning landscape of the Kalahari to travel as far as Sesriem where we'll spend the most incredible two days of photography. We'll explore Sossusvlei, one of the most stunning site of Namibia. Our lodge is inside the Sesriem National Park giving us the freedom to catch the best light both in the morning and in the evening photographing it as it dances around the dunes designing sharp shadows. We'll take a walk to Big Daddy the tallest dune and walk to Dead Vlei with its 500 year old skeleton acacias. Dinners will be served under the stars. Overnight at Sossusvlei Dune Lodge

Wednesday 22 September TOUR DAY 4

We depart from Sossusvlei Lodge at about 09am and take a panoramic flight over the stunning Namib Desert to Swakopmund. This is a great opportunity for some aerial photography as the views are simply breathtaking. Our guide will be driving from Sossusvlei with the luggage and will only arrive in Swakopmund in the afternoon. After lunch the group will be collected for an incredible Desert Reptiles photo session where reptiles such as side-winding adder, horned adder, puff adder, palmetto gecko, scorpion namaqua chameleon as well as scorpions can be photographed at close range in the natural habitat. The afternoons in Swakopmund are often windy and the weather is changeable. So depending on weather we either drive to Walvis Bay for some bird photography or take a walk on the jetty as the sun goes down behind the Ocean. Overnight at Beach Lodge

Thursday 23 September TOUR DAY 5

After breakfast we drive north along the Skeleton Coast via Henties Bay to Cape Cross to visit the seal colony. Cape Cross is the breeding place of the Cape fur seals, which are a species of sea lion. At Cape Cross live about 80,000 to 100,000 seals. After lunch, a short siesta before driving, either north along the coast to photograph lichens and



succulents along the beach, or to go inland towards the Messum Crater for lichen and ancient Welwitschia trees. After the days spent in the stillness of the desert tonight we fall asleep with the sound of waves breaking on the shore.

Overnight at Cape cross hotel

Friday 24 September TOUR DAY 6

Our drive today inland to Uis will take us to the Twyfelfontein area. We leave the Ocean behind and explore yet again a different desert of granite hills. The granite hills are made of rocks that seem fallen from the sky. Arranged one on top of the other these circular rocks design the landscape with bizarre formation. White skeletal acacia trees grow on the rocks with an interesting colour contrast. After lunch we'll take the opportunity to photograph members of the local Herero Community dressed in their traditional Victorian clothing. Overnight at Twyfelfontein Lodge

Saturday 25/Sunday 26 September TOUR DAY 7 - 8

Today we continue via the Grootberg to Opuwo, the hub of Kaokoland, which has a fascinating mix of people, including the traditional Himba people with their goatskin dress and ochre-stained skins. Together with our local contact and Hans, our guide we'll visit the Himba in their villages. Both in the morning and in the late afternoon light we will be able to make some extraordinary portraits of these beautiful and kind people. We will have the privilege of experiencing daily life of this nomadic tribe, who in many ways, still live according to ancient traditions. Strong, powerful faces speak of people who have yet to trade their own culture for what little is being offered to them by western civilisation. Overnight at Fort Sesfontein Lodge and Opuwo Lodge

Monday 27 September TOUR DAY 9

Situated on the western border of Etosha National Park, Hobatere concession area includes elephants, lions, leopards, cheetahs and many more. Hobatere is a privately run concession area of 32 000 ha. and here we'll experience nature at its best. Lions, elephants and cheetah are all free to roam around the our bungalows and in the night is not unusual to hear the roar of a lion just outside your door. Arrival at Hobatere Lodge in time for lunch and an afternoon game drive. Hobatere also has two hideout overlooking a waterhole where we'll have the chance to photograph the animals in their habitat. Overnight at Hobatere Lodge

Tuesday 28 September TOUR DAY 10

We depart early and enter the western board of the Etosha National Park. There are many water holes to visit along the way but once we settle in our waterhole chalets we'll have all the time to photograph wild animals waiting for the sunset. Overnight at Okaukuejo Restacamp water holes chalets.

Wednesday 29 September TOUR DAY 11

After a sunrise game drive we depart to the Erongo Wilderness Lodge nestled amid granite formations on the outskirts of an ancient volcano. These are the Erongo Mountains - a spectacular feature in the heart of a country renowned for it's scenic beauty. Flanked by the Namib Desert to the West and mixed-woodland savannah to the East, the mountains form a rare confluence of ecosystems that give rise to remarkable biodiversity, including a vast array of plant, reptile, mammal and bird species that are endemic to Namibia. The lodge is a founder member of The Erongo Mountain Nature Conservancy, joining 30 private landowners in a collective effort to conserve and protect this natural treasure of over 200 000ha in extent. The Conservancy's mission includes the preservation of the rich cultural heritage in the form of rock paintings and engravings that are found throughout the area, such as at the Paula's Cave rock art site at Erongo Wilderness Lodge. Overnight at Erongo Lodge

Thursday 30 September TOUR DAY 12

After a morning nature drive and breakfast we'll start our drive towards our last lodge. We'll arrive at Amani Lodge and have the opportunity to do the Big Cat tour, a game drive to photograph lions, leopards and cheetahs. Overnight at Amani Lodge

Friday 1 October DEPARTURE DAY

Today after breakfast we'll say our goodbyes as we travel to Hosea Kutako International airport to start our journey home.

Accommodation

Namibia is a land that thrives on tourism but that has been able to keep the highest standard of lodges and hotels. All the accommodation whilst in Namibia will be of a high to a luxury standard. Every room has an en-suite, electricity to charge your equipment and a swimming pool. The lodges of the North of the Country provide mosquito nets. In the chosen lodges the level of care and attention to details is second to none; you'll be welcomed warmly and made to



feel at home.
